Overcoming obstacles to employment

In person employment counseling has been changed since the pandemic in favor of telephone and videoconferencing appointments only. WeCAN has established an employment video conferencing cubicle where employment clients can reserve time at WeCAN for virtual face-to-face consultations with the employment counselor, for interviews with a potential employer, or for computer and printing needs. This has improved scheduling flexibility and reduced staff costs as WeCAN remains available to help clients who want new employment search for jobs and career directions that fit their needs and ambitions. We continue to refer clients when appropriate to free training resources and to PCs for People, for free and low cost PCs and Microsoft Office software to aid in their job search and work.
